

The Republic of Azerbaijan: A Historical Overview of the Second Karabakh War

Abstract

This research paper offers an inquiry into the military attacks committed by the Armenian Armed Forces inside the sovereign territory of Azerbaijan, during the Second Karabakh War in September – November 2020. This publication tackles the multiple missile strikes orchestrated by the ruthless Armenian Armed Forces against the urban centers and innocent civilians of Azerbaijan as well as repeated violations of International Humanitarian Law by Armenian Government authorities. Furthermore, the Republic of Azerbaijan has experienced Europe's most cruel environmental holocaust and ethnic cleansing inside its sovereign territory, in a period of over thirty years of occupation by the Armenian Armed Forces (1988 – 2020).
